In DrupalCon Lille we officially started the IXP Initiative. The IXP Fellowship Initiative is a community-driven initiative to create incentives for companies to guide new developers through the very beginning of their career in Drupal. It seeks to address several issues:

Even ""Junior Drupal Developer"" roles often require at least 6mo-lyr of experience.
 Companies who invest in early development roles and emerging talent make a large investment in talent development, but then larger organizations in wealthier countries are able to hire the newly trained developers away at rates they can't compete with.
